Competition Terms and Conditions

1. This competition is open to entrants of all ages, except for anyone professionally associated with the competition.
2. All information detailing how to enter this competition forms part of these terms and conditions. It is a condition of entry that all rules are accepted as final and that the entrant agrees to abide by these rules. Submission of an entry will be taken to mean acceptance of these terms and conditions.
3. To enter this competition, entrants must submit their design(s) or drawing(s) on A4 paper, along with an explanation of the inspiration for their design(s). Entrants must include their name, address and contact telephone number on the reverse of each entry and must complete the Entry Form. The written element of an entry must be in English and be no more than 250 words long. Entries will not be returned.
4. The design should be a piece of outdoor street art expressing the theme 'Inspiring Women'. Please note that the term women is to be taken to include woman.

The chosen theme is deliberately broad and can be interpreted in one of two ways. In either interpretation of the theme the aim will be to create art work that is meaningful and will inspire women. The art design should preferably depict a woman or women with a connection to Gibraltar who through their endeavours have inspired and will motivate future generations.

(1) The art design presented can feature a particular woman or women who through her accomplishments has inspired others. Her achievements, which should be substantive and can be one from a range of fields such as sport, adventure, science, technology, engineering, mathematics, the Arts including performing arts and literature, politics....

(2) The art design can feature a more generic representation of a woman or women.

5. The final winning design will be situated at Casemates Tunnel. The design will be closely viewable from the entire area and must be made with the current size, proportions and restrictions in mind.
6. All entries must be received by 4pm on Friday 7th June 2019.
7. All entries submitted must be the original work of the individual. It is the responsibility of each entrant to ensure that their entry does not infringe the intellectual rights of any third party or any laws.

8. Rights in respect of all designs, except in the overall winning design, submitted for this competition remain with the respective entrants. However, in consideration of the Government of Gibraltar providing the competition, each entrant grants a worldwide, irrevocable, perpetual license to H.M. Government of Gibraltar or their agents to feature any or all of the submitted designs in any of their publications, their websites and/or in any promotional material connected to this competition without payment to the entrant.
9. Only three entries may be submitted per person. Late, illegible, incomplete, defaced entries or entries not within the design criteria will not be accepted. No responsibility can be accepted for lost entries and proof of transmission will not be accepted as proof of receipt.
10. The decision of the judges is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
11. The winning entrant will have their design turned into a full scale mural. This will be done by the entrant or by the person(s) hired by the entrant. The entrant is fully responsible to bring the artwork into fruition. All expenses to create the mural will be met by winner. This will be on permanent display at Casemates Tunnel. The winner will be invited to attend the unveiling of the design.
12. The winner shall be required to take part in any publicity as required by the Government of Gibraltar.
13. The prize is £2,000, which includes material, labour, equipment and prize money. 50% of the prize money will be paid prior to commencement of the works and the final payment will be upon completion of the mural, on the dates allocated.
14. The prize money, has been worked out accurately and will not be flexible. The artist needs to ensure they do not overspend.
15. The artist will sign an undertaking, confirming that all works shall be completed on the dates allocated.
16. The artist will be liable to protect and clean the floors adjacent to the artwork during and after the completion of the mural. The artist will ensure to have the area cordoned off, as to protect the public from getting stained.
17. H.M. Government of Gibraltar may, at its absolute discretion, vary, amend or cancel the competition and the entrant must agree that no liability shall attach to the Government as a result thereof.
